## Parashat Vayechi - 5766

### In memory of Irwin Schmeltz – Yitzchak ben Avraham Aryeh

This week's Parashah, VaYechi, begins with the "petirah," the departure of Yaakov Avinu, Z"L, after a lifetime of triumphs and of suffering, where Yaakov left the world as the "Bechir She-BeAvot," the most favored of the Patriarchs, whose defining characteristic was "Emmet," truth. Last week, the shul lost Irwin Schmeltz, one of its finest members, who also experienced a lifetime of triumph and of great suffering, who together with his wife, Diane, raised a wonderful family, and whose defining characteristics were "Anivut," Modesty, "Ne'emanut," Loyalty, and "Yashrut," Uprightness.

Last week was Chanukah, when at his beautiful "levaya," conducted before a "full house" of fellow congregants and other lifetime contacts, no eulogies were permitted because of the holiday, a fact that he would not have minded at all. My hope is that this mini-bio will spread a little more information about him. He was a brilliant environmental chemist, who made no attempt to advertise that fact. He was one of the earliest to open the eyes of the world to the dangers of tobacco and tobacco smoke. Before moving to Monsey, he lived in Philadelphia where, together with his wife, Diane, he began to raise his family. Eventually there would be four children: Jonathan, Benjie, Rina and Joey. In Philadelphia, he served as president of the Young Israel of Wynnefield.

In 1973, he moved to Monsey, together with his family, where he became an early member of Congregation Bais Torah, then in its infancy. He and Diane sent all the children to Yeshivat Hadar, where they imbibed the principles of religious zionism, that Irwin and Diane subscribed to, and the whole family drank in the teachings of Rabbi Berel Wein, the founding rabbi of Congregation Bais Torah.

Part of the suffering of Yaakov Avinu, Z"L, included twenty-two years of not knowing the fate of one of his sons. But in June of 1997, the Schmeltz family sustained an incalculable loss, with the sudden death of their son and brother, Benjie, who had devoted himself to "Kiruv," and had become Rabbi and Educational Director of the Murray Hill Synagogue. Many of the congregants of that Synagogue were "Chozrim BiTeshuvah," recent returnees to Judaism, whose thirst for knowledge of their heritage was equaled by Benjie's desire to impart Jewish knowledge. The nature of this loss, the death of a child, is such that it can never be fully adjusted to by the parents. Benjie was described in the N.Y. Times as a "gentle young man, with a beautiful neshama" and by a colleague, Rabbi Nathaniel Helfgot, as "...a true disciple of Aharon HaKohen bringing hundreds of Jews back to Torah; a lover of peace and mankind who was unbelievably dedicated to the calling of spreading Torah and was blessed with a sweetness and smile that could melt any heart..."

One of Irwin's reactions to the loss of Benjie was the loan of a Sefer Torah to Congregation Bais Torah, for continuous use, that typified so well the character of the son and the wishes of the parents, that had been cut short. Another action taken by Irwin was to write a book called "Remembering Benjie," that sought to capture events and ideas important to his son. At approximately the time of the tragedy, Irwin was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease, a devastating illness, that would ultimately take his life.

During the period of his illness, his wife, Diane, did all she possibly could to help him. And Rabbi Yossi Fischer, teacher of one of the "Daf Yomi" groups in the shul, said of Irwin that he was a loyal member, who had attended the class when he was in good health and during the time of his sickness.

To a friend who displayed character traits emulating those of the "Ribbono shel Olam," our wish is "Yehi Zichro Baruch," May his mention be a source of blessing for his wife, his family and for the people of Israel. PF
