Parashat Vaera – 5767 – "Kal VaChomer"

Last Shabbat, in Shemot (3), Moshe led the flocks of Yitro deep into the Wilderness, to the Mountain of G-d, to the Burning Bush. It was there that HaShem, so to speak, recruited him, despite his protestations of inadequacy, to serve as His Messenger, with his brother, Aharon, acting as his spokesman, to lead the People of Israel out of Egypt, the House of their Bondage. At the end of Parashat Shemot, Moshe and Aharon appeared before Pharaoh and transmitted the Command of HaShem, "Send out My People..." (Shemot 5:1). Pharaoh responded, "Who is HaShem that I should heed His voice to send out Israel? I do not know HaShem, nor will I send out Israel!" (Shemot 5:2) Then the taskmasters of the Jewish slaves were commanded by Pharaoh to change the work rules; the slaves had to produce the same number of bricks, but now the slaves had to find the straw, a necessary ingredient for making bricks, by themselves! The foremen said to Moshe and Aharon, "May HaShem look upon you and judge, for you have made our very scent abhorrent in the eyes of Pharaoh and the eyes of his servants, to place a sword in their hands, to murder us." (Shemot 5:21) And Moshe complained to HaShem, "...My L-rd, why have You done evil to this People, why have You sent me?" (Shemot 5:22) At the beginning of Parashat Vaera, HaShem renews His promise made to the Avot that He will redeem their descendants from slavery, and commands Moshe to transmit this message to the Children of Israel. And the Torah tells us, "So Moshe spoke accordingly to the Children of Israel; but they did not heed Moshe, because of shortness of breath and hard work." Shemot (6:9) HaShem speaks to Moshe again, "Go and speak to Pharaoh, King of Egypt, and demand that he send the Children of Israel from his land." (Shemot 6:11) To this, Moshe responds with a "Kal VaChomer," an argument based on "a Fortiori" logic, that if one finds a stringency in the case of a minor premise, then this stringency must certainly apply to a major premise – "And Moshe spoke before HaShem, saying, 'Behold the Children of Israel have not listened to me, so how will Pharaoh listen to me? And I have sealed lips!" - where the Children of Israel correspond to the "minor premise" and the Pharaoh of Egypt corresponds to the "major premise."
In his commentary on the Torah called "Kedushas Levi," Rav Levi Yitzchak of Berditchev cites one of his teachers, Rav Dov Behr of Mezerich, as teaching that the Thirteen Principles by which the Torah is interpreted (taught by Rabbi Yishmael) correspond to the Thirteen Divine Attributes, revealed by HaShem to Moshe, the recitation of which forms the basis of our Prayers for Forgiveness: "HaShem, HaShem, Almighty, Compassionate and Gracious, Slow to Anger, and Abundant in Kindness and Truth; Preserver of Kindness for thousands of generations, Forgiver of Iniquity, Willful Sin, and Error, and Who Cleanses...'

Rabbi Yishmael's Thirteen Principles, recited daily after the "Korbanot," "Sacrifices" Section, begin: "Rabbi Yishmael teaches, 'By Thirteen Principles is the Torah interpreted: 1) The "Kal VaChomer" (explained above)

2) The "Gezerah Shavah" – Tradition teaches that two independent laws or cases may shed light upon one another. The indication is that the same or similar words appear in both cases. For example, the word "BeMo'ado," "in its proper time" (BaMidbar 28:2) is understood to mean that the Daily Offering is to be brought even on Shabbat. The same word in the context of Pesach teaches that the Pesach Offering is also to be brought even on Shabbat. And so on through Principle 13.

The Attribute of "E-L," "Almighty," corresponds to the Principle of "Kal VaChomer," and allows for communication, so to speak, between the Infinite G-d and His frail, finite and mortal creature, the human being. Rav Dov Behr said that the faces of the "Keruvim" were the faces of children, and represented the teaching of Torah by a Master to his student, where the Master has lowered himself to the level of his student and, by analogy, between the Infinite Author of the Torah to His **mortal**, **but holy creatures**, the People of Israel. Similarly, the Attribute of "Rachum," "Compassionate," corresponds to the Principle of "Gezerah Shavah," for in a manner corresponding to saying that two distinct cases have the same law, so is it, in the earthly manifestation of compassion, when a rich individual has mercy on a poor individual, that the rich individual must be able to **feel empathy** for the poor person; he must be able to imagine himself on the same economic level, and feel the same pain as the poor person. In the Divine manifestation of "Compassion," we find an example in Shemot 3:7, "And HaShem said, "I have indeed seen the affliction of My People that is in Egypt, and I have heard their cries because of its taskmasters, for I have known their suffering." The Holy One, Blessed is He, as it were, contracts Himself, and descends to our level, in order to feel the pain of His holy nation, Israel.

May HaShem feel the danger that threatens His People now as well, and come to our aid.
