Parashas Pekudei - 5765 - Shabbas and the Mishkan (Reprinted from 2005)

In this week's Parashah, we read of the completion of the Mishkan, that served as the abode of the Divine Presence and as the spiritual center of the People of Israel during their sojourn in the Wilderness and for the first several hundred years of their residence in the Land of Israel.

Shemos 39:32 reads "All the work of the Mishkan was completed, and the Children of Israel had done everything that HaShem commanded Moshe, so did they do." And Shemos 39:43 continues, introducing the element of blessing, "Moshe saw the entire work, and behold! – they had done it as HaShem had commanded, so had they done! And Moshe blessed them." We find an investment of holiness in the Mishkan in Shemos 40:9, "You shall take the anointment oil and anoint the Tabernacle and everything that is in it, sanctify it and all its utensils, and it shall become holy." And towards the end of Parashas Pekudei, we find the finishing touch applied by the Master of the Project, Moshe Rabbeinu, "He erected the courtyard, all around the Tabernacle and the Altar, and he emplaced the Curtain of the Gate of the Courtyard. So Moshe completed the work." (Shemos 40:33)

This sequence of verses bears an interesting resemblance to the verses in Bereshis (2:1-3) that describe the completion of the Creation of the Universe by HaShem, "Thus the heaven and the earth were finished, and all their array. By the Seventh Day G-d completed His work which He had done, and He abstained on the Seventh Day from all His work which He had done. G-d blessed the Seventh Day and sanctified it because on it He abstained from all His work that G-d created to make."

Thus, in each case, we see the completion of a large project, review by the Master of the Project, investment of sanctity, in the first case, at the beginning of Time, in the Day that represented the completion of labor and in the second, in each of the completed items and in the ministers, the Kohanim – and a blessing given, in the earlier case, to the Holy Day of the Shabbas and in the later, to the Holy Nation, the People of Israel.

We now understand better a number of things which might have otherwise seemed puzzling. We understand the reference to Shabbas at the beginning of Parashas Vayakhel, where the summary of the construction of the Mishkan was begun, and the Torah seemed to deviate from the subject matter at hand, and mentioned the Shabbas, "...These are the things that HaShem commanded, to do them: On six days, work may be done, but the Seventh day shall be holy for you, a Day of Complete Rest for HaShem..." (Shemos 35:1-2)

We also better understand the linkage of the concept of "Melacha," the 39 categories of purposeful, creative activity prohibited on the Shabbas, with the activities involved in the Creation of the Mishkan, and their identification as well with those used by the Creator of the Universe in fashioning the World.

We can better understand as well the loving, personal relationship between the People of Israel and the Day of Shabbas, expressed on Friday Night, the Eve of Shabbas, in the "Lecha Dodi," "Come, My Beloved" Prayer:

"Come in Peace, Crown of Her Husband, In Joy and great Happiness, Among the believers of the Treasured Nation – Enter, My Bride, O Enter, My Bride."

"Come, My Beloved, to greet the Bride, Let us welcome the Holy Shabbas."
