Parashas Shophtim – 5768

"You Shall Surely Set Over Yourself a King" (Devarim 17:15)

In Parashas Shophtim, the Torah outlines the requirements of Jewish Leadership. "You shall not pervert judgment nor take excessive notice of either party. You shall not accept a bribe, for the bribe will blind the eyes of the wise and make just words crooked. **Righteousness, Righteousness** shall you pursue, so that you will live and possess the Land that HaShem, your G-d, has given you." (Devarim 16:19-20)

"According to the teaching that they will teach you, and according to the judgment that they will say to you, shall you do; you shall not deviate from the word that they will tell you, right or left." (Devarim 17:11)

And you must look for characteristics in a King that will allow him to attain the following level: "So that his heart does not become haughty over his brothers, and **not turn from the Commandments, right or left**, so that he will prolong years over his Kingdom, he and his sons amidst Israel."

Now this year is an Election Year in the United States, in which we will elect a new president who is sworn to conduct the affairs of the Country according to a set of rules, enshrined in the Constitution of the United States. Although its rules do not reach the level of the Torah, a lot of its content **is based upon it.** Like the King of Israel who had to carry a Sefer Torah with him at all times, our president has a high standard to uphold.

Last week the Convention of the Democratic Party took place in Denver, and it was indeed spectacular. The first three nights were broadcast from an arena designed for the Denver basketball team (seating about 20,000), the fourth and last night, when Barack Obama accepted the nomination of his Party, the event was broadcast from the much larger (seating about 80,000) stadium designed for the Denver football team. I liked the fact that both Clintons seemed to jettison their hard feelings caused by the run-up to the Convention. And I liked the candidate's views on universal education, and on the right of all U.S. citizens to medical insurance. Indeed, everything that was said was positive and impressive. It was what wasn't said that disturbed me. I would have liked to know more about the candidate's feelings about the ideas expressed by Reverend Wright, in whose church Obama sat for twenty years, and about the Reverend's friendship with Minister Farrakhan, who has described Judaism as a "gutter religion."

This week, the Convention of the Republican Party is taking place in St. Paul, Minnesota. The character of their candidate is deeply rooted in the American military, and it was delineated mainly based on his experiences in the Vietnam War. During that conflict, he was seriously wounded in battle, but he insisted on returning to action. More significant was his resistance to the brutal torture that he received in the "Hanoi Hilton" and, his refusal to leave captivity earlier than his troops, when his captors offered him early release.

It seems to me that the capacity for self-sacrifice is a vital ingredient of one's qualification to be president. Now Barack Obama qualifies in this area, in that he sacrificed what surely would have been a lucrative career as an attorney for work in community organization, which led him to his entry into politics. However, the degree of his self-sacrifice undoubtedly pales before that of John McCain. Besides, as I alluded to above, I fear for his attitude concerning Israel. Therefore, I will vote for McCain (thereby violating my mother, A"H's rule not to disclose to anyone whom she was voting for, based on the "secret ballot" provision in the Constitution).

The Torah says in Devarim (29:28), "The secret things belong to HaShem" and Shelomo HaMelech says in Mishlei (21:1), "The heart of the King is in the Hand of HaShem, to be directed in any direction the Almighty wishes." Therefore, one cannot see into the heart of either candidate, although I say again that I feel more comfortable with John McCain. PF
