Parashas Korach - 5769 - Korach, Obama and the Distortion of Unity

This is going to be a stretch. For in this essay, I will try to draw a comparison between the ideas of Korach, who, as Chaza"l say, was a "Pikeach," a very clever man, and our president, also for sure a "Pikeach." Both of them have profound arguments underlying their world views, but both of them have a fatal flaw in their conclusions. I read through Obama's "Speech to the Muslim World," and though much of what he says is very laudable, there is a flaw in his reasoning, as there was in Korach's, referring to a distortion of the Idea of Unity and Equality, among individuals, in Korach's case, and among nations and religions, in Obama's.

Let me start with Korach, proceeding chronologically. Korach and his 250 distinguished followers appeared before Moshe and declared, "You have assumed too much for yourselves, for the entire congregation is holy, and HaShem is among them. Why then do you elevate yourselves above the entire congregation of G-d?" (BaMidbar 16:3) Rabbi Yoseph Y. Jacobson, in identifying Korach as "The Father of Spiritual Anarchy," writes as follows:

"These are powerful words. They resonate to many a mind. G-d is within each and every person... Holiness, truth, grace, depth, integrity and transcendence are imbedded in each and every heart... Within every pulsating heart flows the spiritual light, so why is Moses telling people what G-d wants? Why is Aharon serving as the exclusive High Priest of G-d? Why does a Jew need Moses to teach him the word of G-d and Aharon to perform the service in the Holy Temple in his stead, when he himself possesses a soul that is a spark of the divine flame? Why can't he realize his relationship with G-d on his own, without teachers, leaders and priests in his spiritual life?"

"Korach is the father of spiritual anarchy...We are all divine, and hence we are all one. Imagine there were no Moses, no Aharon, no Sanctuary, no Kohanites, Levites or Israelites, and no religious authorities too... And the Jews would live as one. And then from the Jews, Korach believed, the holistic energy-flow would travel to all mankind. And the world would live as one."

Korach's error is his assumption of the spiritual equality of all Jews. Each Jew is born with the gift of "Bechirah Chofshit," Freedom of Choice. What he or she does with that gift differentiates between Jews. One individual may exert himself-or-herself to the utmost, and rise to the level of Moshe or Miriam. He may do "Teshuvah," and become as great as Rabbi Akiva. Or he may be driven by his ego and be pulled down to the level of Yerayam ben Nevat.

Barak Hussein Obama is without doubt a very brilliant individual. He was able to inspire an entire generation of Americans, not to mention the world, with his romanticized view of Unity. **All nations and all religions are equal.** He does not (yet) recognize the greater holiness of Judaism, and its role in teaching and uplifting the two younger, and far less sophisticated religions.

This led him to a distortion of history in his "Speech to the Muslim World." Where he could have educated his tremendous audience as to the primacy of the claim of the Jewish People to the Holy Land by virtue of Divine promises to give the Land to the People of Israel, and their living in the Land for a thousand years under the rule of many Kings, inspired by some fifty Prophets, with two glorious Temples, and never totally abandoning the Land for a moment during all of its history, all he could say was that "the aspiration for a Jewish homeland is rooted in a tragic history that cannot be denied."

Thus, he failed in his one historic test so far. Hopefully, he will have other opportunities to rectify that error, and he will be able to play a role in the historical process of the restoration of the "House of David" and the unification of all of the nations, as it says, "And HaShem will become King over all of the World; on that day, HaShem will be One and His Name One." (Zechariah 14:9)
