Parshas Balak – 5770 Ten Things Created at Twilight and the "Zoo Rabbi"

Among the ten items listed in Pirkei Avos (5:8) as having been created on the first Shabbos Eve at twilight was the "Mouth of the Donkey," presumably referring to Bilaam's Donkey, as that is the only Speaking Donkey in Tanach. Each of the ten things involved a temporary suspension of natural law, such as the Mohn or the Well of Miriam, or an enhancement of a gift already granted to humanity, such as the ability to write.

In general, however, donkeys do not speak. Bilaam had already indicated his extreme hatred of the Jewish People by rising at dawn and saddling his donkey, to get an early start on his hateful mission. En route, he demonstrated that absolutely nothing would stop him, neither the voice of G-d Himself nor the voice of his donkey, which undoubtedly would have shocked most of us, and gained our attention.

Contemporary Controversy Involving Animals

Rabbi Natan Slifkin, born in Manchester, England, studied at Yeshivas Sha'arei Torah (English version thereof). He then moved to Israel, where he furthered his studies at Yeshivas Midrash Shmuel and the Mir Yeshiva. He now teaches a "Zoo Torah" Course at Yeshivas Lev HaTorah in Ramat Bet Shemesh, where he has become known as the "Zoo Rabbi." Several years ago, Rabbi Slifkin began teaching about the relationship between Judaism and the animal kingdom at the Jerusalem Biblical Zoo. He then developed the "Zoo Torah" Program, which is presented worldwide. He has a lifelong fascination with wildlife, and he enjoys telling audiences that his parents took him to the London Zoo when he was three, and picked him up when he was twelve. The Slifkins now live in Ramat Bet Shemesh, along with their children, and an assortment of exotic pets, including chinchillas, hedgehogs, parakeets, finches, guanas, geckos, turtles and snakes.

What makes this rabbi so controversial? He has written a dozen books, including "Mysterious Creatures; Intriguing Torah Enigmas of Natural and Unnatural History" (Targum Press, 2003), "The Science of Torah; The Reflection of Torah in the Laws of Science, the Creation of the Universe and the Development of Life" (Targum Press 2001), "The Camel, the Hare, and the Hyrax; a Study of the Animals with One Kosher Sign in Light of Modern Zoology" (Targum Press 2004) and "The Challenge of Creation; Judaism's Encounter with Science, Cosmology and Evolution" (Zoo Torah 2006), all of which have been banned by rabbinic luminaries of the Charedi world in Israel. Rabbi Slifkin's works have been praised by other "gedolim," who reject the ban. These include Rabbi Yisroel Belsky, Rabbi Aryeh Carmell, and Rabbi Shmuel Kamenetsky.
