Parashas Vayechi - 5771 –

Will the Ten Tribes Ever Return?

After the split of the United Kingdom of Israel into the Kingdom of Yehudah and the Kingdom of secessionist Israel, and the disastrous reign of Yeravam ben Nevat, followed by a succession of rulers of very dubious character, the Kingdom of Israel was conquered by Asher, and exiled far from its homeland. The question before us is, “Will the Ten Lost Tribes ever return?”

In Parashas Vayechi, Yaakov Avinu blesses his sons. But the Midrash tells us that just before, he wanted to reveal the fate of his descendants at the end of days, but HaShem would not allow him to. Yaakov knew the answer to the question posed above, but he was not permitted to reveal it. Yaakov also sees that Yehoshua, a descendant of Ephraim, would lead the People of Israel into the Land of Israel, and command the awe of the nations when HaShem performs a miracle for him by suspending time at Yehoshua’s command: “Sun, remain at rest in Givon, and Moon, in the Valley of Ayalon.” Perhaps he also sees, at the end of days, Mashiach ben Yoseph, a descendant of Ephraim, participating in the Redemption of Israel, and that is why he moved his hands to give a greater blessing to Ephraim than to the “bechor,” Menashe.

In the Haphtarah of Parashas Vayigash, we find: *“The word of HaShem came to me, saying: ‘Now you, son of man, take yourself one wooden tablet, and write upon it, ‘For Yehudah, and the Children of Israel, his comrades,’ and take another wooden tablet and write upon it, ‘For Yoseph, the wooden tablet of Ephraim, and all the Children of Israel, his comrades.’ And bring close to yourself, one to the other, like a single wooden tablet, and they shall become one in your hand.”* (Yechezkel 37:15-17) This seems a rather clear prophecy of the eventual reunification of the entire People of Israel.

We also find a startling dispute in Perek Chelek of Maseches Sanhedrin 110b, “ ‘The Ten Tribes will not return, as it says, ‘And He sent them to a far-away land, as this very day;’ just as a day occurs and after it is over, it is over, so did the Ten Tribes have their place in history, but when it passed, it passed forever;’ this was the opinion of Rabbi Akiva. Rabbi Eliezer counters by interpreting the same words, ‘as this very day’ to mean, just as a day has cloudy periods and then sunshine, so it will be with the Ten Tribes, for whom history is now dark, their time will come again to be in the sunshine of history.” The most surprising viewpoint here is that of Rabbi Akiva, in light of his encouraging words to his colleagues when they stood overlooking the destroyed Temple Mount, and also his encouragement of Bar Kochba. But perhaps it was the disastrous fall of Bar Kochba and the massacre that followed, that changed Rabbi Akiva’s attitude to a more pessimistic one.

The wise men who formulated the text of the Tephilos, presumably the “Anshei Knesses HaGedolah,” surely believed that the Ten Tribes would return, for they composed the following Tephila as an introduction to the Shemoneh Esray, “Rock of Israel, arise to the defense of Israel, and redeem, as You promised, Yehudah **and Israel**. Our Redeemer, the L-rd of Hosts is His Name, the Holy One of Israel; Blessed are You, the Redeemer of Israel.”
