Parashas Vayakhel - 5771 –

“**Moshe commanded that they proclaim throughout the camp**”

(**Shemos 36:6**)

Chaza”l explain that the source that that the activity of “Carrying in ‘Reshus HaRabim’ (the ‘public domain’) is considered a מלאכה, a “Melacha” on Shabbos is the verse cited in the title, “וַיֹּצֵא מֹשֶׁה וְעֵבְרֵי קוֹל בְּמַחְנֵה לְאֹמֶר אִשׁ וְאִשָּׁה אֶל עֵשׂוֹ עוֹד מְלָאכָה...” indicating that the act of carrying, or in this case, passing a proclamation throughout the public domain, is considered one of the acts of conscious creative activities which are prohibited on Shabbos.

We find that Chaza”l are particularly strict with regard to the Melacha of transferring objects in the public domain, in that this is the reason that we do not blow the shofar on Shabbos, as the Gemara (Rosh HaShanah 29b) explains, “it is a decree lest one take a shofar in his hand and go to an expert for instruction, and he will carry it four ‘amos’ in the public domain”, and this is also the reason we do not shake the ‘lulav’ on Shabbos (Succah 42b), nor read the ‘Megillah’ on Purim (Megillah 4b). And this is very surprising that Chaza”l would uproot a Mitzvah of the Torah or even a Mitzvah of Chaza”l, such as Megillah, because some foolish person might carry it in “reshus harabim,” which in any case is a difficult מצואת to find, since it requires a street 16 ‘amos’ wide and, according to some, that 600,000 people travel on it daily.

Rabbi Schwab suggests that it is because this Melacha is different qualitatively from other Melachos, in that no change is produced in the object in question; rather, only its location is changed, and it was never fully accepted by the majority of the People, that such emphasis is put on it. As the Prophet Yirmiyahu says, “Do not carry on Shabbos”... “Do not carry objects from your houses on Shabbos” (Yirmiyahu 17:21-22)

And also surprising is the fact that many Melachos are not explained at length in the Talmud, yet the Talmud devotes a number of chapters to it in Maseches Shabbos, and an entire Masechta; namely Eruvin, is dedicated to the purpose of protecting against the violation of this prohibition.

Rav Schwab recalls a teaching of Rabbi Shimshon Rephoel Hirsch to the effect that there are two reasons for the observance of Shabbos, the first as a commemoration of the Creation of the Universe by G-d, the second that we should remember our experience of being slaves in Egypt, from which HaShem redeemed us. Now the Melachos of removing an object from domain to domain or transferring it in the public domain are not likely in commemoration of the Creation because, as mentioned above, nothing new is created here. It is more likely that this is to commemorate the experience of slavery in Egypt, when our social lives were inhibited by our “masters,” such that we could not leave our houses or have social intercourse with friends.

Another idea at play here is that Shabbos is reserved for the Jewish People. And in fact, this goes so far as the teaching that a non-Jew who observes the Shabbos is liable to the death penalty. A private domain is the province of the Jew, while the boundary-less public domain is the province of the non-Jewish populations of the world. One might say that the Holiness of Shabbos does not exist, in a sense, in the public domain. And this separation from the non-Jewish world, this Holiness, we learned at “Har Sinai,” when HaShem chose us as His “Treasured People.”

Rabbi Schwab followed this Dvar Torah with the re-publication of a letter that he wrote more than thirty years ago, arguing against the construction of an “Eruv” around Manhattan Island, for various reasons, in order, basically, to preserve the Holiness of the Shabbos.
