## Parashas Chayei Sarah – 5772 – The “Akeidah” as a Double-Edged Sword

One of Adam HaRishon's first tasks was to assign permanent names to the creatures that HaShem had brought into being. A key verse in the History of Man is *Bereshis (2:20)*, “*And the man assigned names to all the cattle and to the birds of the sky and to every beast of the field; but as for man, he did not find a helper corresponding to him.*” Without his wife, Man is nameless. The Creator alleviated Adam HaRishon's predicament by creating for him an “Ezer K'negdo,” a “helper corresponding to him,” Chava.

The first couple begins its task of populating the world by producing two boys, Kayin and Hevel. Chava has begun to fulfill her role as “*aim-kol-choi*,” the biological mother of all of humanity. Hevel becomes a shepherd, while Kayin is a farmer. Kayin has a spiritual impulse, and makes an offering to HaShem “*mi-pri ha'adamah*,” “*from the fruit of the ground.*” (*Bereshis 4:3*) Inspired, Hevel selects “*the firstlings and the choicest of his flock*” (*Bereshis 4:4*) as his offering. HaShem indicates pleasure with Hevel's offering, but not with Kayin's. Kayin is depressed and acts out his depression by killing his brother. We hear no note of sadness, not from Hevel's biological father, Adam HaRishon, nor from his biological mother, Chava. The Torah merely reports that “*Adam knew his wife again, and she bore a son and named him Seth, because G-d has provided me another child in place of Hevel, for Kayin killed him.*” (*Bereshis 4:25*) An act of substitution has taken place; Seth for Hevel; no more and no less.

Twenty generations will pass, ten from Adam to Noach, ten more from Noach till Avraham, until the word “love” appears regarding the relationship between a parent and a child. In Parashas Vayera, HaShem confronts Avraham with what will be his tenth, last, and hardest “*nisayon*” test of faith. “*And it happened after these things that G-d tested Avraham and said to him, ‘Avraham’ and he replied ‘Here I am.’ And He said, ‘Please take your son, your only son, whom you love – Yitzchok – and go to the land of Moriah; bring him up there as an offering upon one of the mountains which I shall tell you.’*” (*Bereshis 22:1-2*) And Avraham knew that Sarah's heart was for Yitzchok an inexhaustible reservoir of love.

Last week it was Avraham's turn to take the “*nisayon*” of ‘Akeidas Yitzchok,’ the “Binding of Yitzchok;” this week it is Sarah's. Last week, Avraham passed the test by consenting to offer up his beloved son as an offering to HaShem. This week, Sarah passes the test by passing away. On the words “*to eulogize Sarah and to weep for her*” (*Bereshis 23:2*) Rashi begins his commentary by asking, “Why is it that the death of Sarah is discussed by the Torah right after the account of the ‘Binding of Yitzchok?’ And he answers that ‘one was a cause for the other, for she heard that her husband was prepared to sacrifice their beloved son, and it was only by the intervention of HaShem that the tragedy did not occur. When she heard this, her soul left her.’” (Tanchuma; end of Vayera, Pirkei D'Rabbi Eliezer, Chapter 32)

When Avraham consented to sacrifice his son, he was also consenting to the death of his wife. This may be the reason that the word “*ve-livkosah*,” “*and to weep for her*” is written with a small “Choff,” because he himself, was responsible, in a way, for her death.
