Parshas Tetzaveh

"Bigdei Kehunah," Garments of the Priest – Clothes Make the Man

Last Shabbos, Parashas Terumah described the "Mishkan," the Sanctuary, and its vessels. This Shabbos, we read Parashas Tetzaveh, which basically describes the "Bigdei Kehunah," the garments worn by the "Kohanim," the Priests, who served in the "Mishkan," as the Torah says, "And bring near to yourself Aharon and his sons with him, from among the Children of Israel, that they may serve Me in the priest's office – Aharon, Nadav and Avihu, Elazar and Itamar, the sons of Aharon. And you shall make holy garments for Aharon, your brother, for splendor and for beauty..." (*Shemos 28:1-2*) Before going into detail regarding these garments, it would be helpful to discuss the role of garments in general in Judaism.

The first appearance of the concept of clothing in the Torah is in the context of Adam and Chava, who, at their creation were described as "And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and they were not ashamed." (*Bereshis 2:25*) The "nachash," seduced Chava, who persuaded Adam into eating from the Tree of Knowledge, and the result is "And the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked, and they sewed together fig-leaves and made them into aprons." (*Bereshis 3:7*) After punishing all three appropriately, and before the first two human beings were expelled from the Garden, we are told "And the L-rd G-d made for Adam and his wife garments of skin(s) and clothed them." (*Bereshis 3:21*) We see from the above that the basic purpose of clothing is "Tzenius," modesty; to cover one's nakedness. A similar selection, involving architecture directly, and clothing peripherally, is where the Torah describes the construction of the altar, where we find, "Neither shall you go up by steps on My altar, so that your nakedness not be uncovered upon it." (*Shemos 20:23*)

A possible linguistic explanation of the word "begged," meaning "garment," is that the Hebrew word is spelled "Beis," "Gimmel," "Dalet," the second, third and fourth letters of the alphabet. But the "Aleph," is missing! Perhaps this is because the "Aleph," representing "Anochi," represents the essence of the person, which his or her clothing allow him or her to express.

The Jewish People is divided into three groupings with respect to their duties in the Temple. "Kohanim" (Priests) perform all the sacrificial service and also serve as the conduit between HaShem and the People, transmitting His Blessing to them. They are the only ones involved in the wearing of special garments, the "Bigdei Kehunah." The "Leviim" serve as assistants to the "Kohanim," constitute the Temple choir and provide the musical background for the Temple Service. Finally, the lowest grouping with regard to Temple Service, the Yisroelim, the ordinary Jews, whose only duty in the Temple Service was to bring sacrifices, and obtain atonement. Nevertheless, the entire nation of Israel is referred to as, "A Kingdom of Priests and a Holy Nation." (*Shemos 19:6*)

There is, of course, an entirely separate measure of holiness and spirituality, and that has to do with the study of Torah, G-d's Law, in which the three groupings mentioned above have absolutely no relevance.

Within the "Kohanim," there are two basic groupings, the "Kohen Gadol," (the "High Priest"), consisting of one individual, and the "Kohanim Hedyotim," the "Ordinary Priests," consisting of all the other "Kohanim." With regard to "Bigdei Kehunah," the "Kohen Gadol" wore eight garments containing some gold, the "Bigdei Zahav," while the "Kohanim Hedyotim" wore four garments of white linen, known as the "Bigdei Lavan." On Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, the "Kohen Gadol" wore only the "Bigdei Lavan."

In Maseches Zevachim 88a-b, we find a statement by Rav Eynini bar Sasson, linking the eight garments of the High Priest to atonement for various sins. He begins with the "Kesones," the Tunic, and says that it atones for the sin of spilling blood; "Mochnosayim," Trousers, atone for the sin of sexual immorality; the "Mitznefes," the Turban, atones for arrogance; the "Avnet," the Belt, atones for sins of the imagination, the "Choshen," the Breastplate, atones for injustice; the "Ephod," the Ornament worn by the High Priest on his Chest, atones for idol worship; the "Me'il," the Robe, atones for slander, because the robe in its movement also produced sound by virtue of bells attached to its bottom, and the "Tzits," the Forehead Plate, worn by the High Priest, atoned for impudence.

Thus, the individual who entered the Holy of Holies on the holiest day of the year to secure atonement for the People, wore garments which symbolized atonement for the various sins of the human personality.
