Parashas Tzav Commands; The Essence of the Torah and Judaism

This week's parashah, Parashas Tzav, begins, "And HaShem spoke to Moshe, saying: 'Command Aharon and his sons, as follows, 'This is the Law of the Elevation Offering...'' (Vayikra 6:1-2) Rashi comments, "The word 'Tzav,' or Command, means, especially 'to call into action' for the immediate future, and for all generations." And it is well known that – "זריזות"readiness for action, was and remains a characteristic of "Kohanim." And counter-intuitively, we find the statement of Rabbi Chanina in Kiddushin 31a, "If we find someone who is not commanded to perform a certain "Mitzvah" to have performed it, how much more can we expect to find that "Mitzvah" to have been performed by someone who was commanded to perform it, for 'Greater is the merit of someone who was commanded to perform an action than that of one who does that action voluntarily.' "

Last Shabbos was Rosh Chodesh Nissan, "Chodesh HaAviv," the Month of Spring and "Chodesh HaGeulah," the Month of Redemption, the month concerning which HaShem commanded, "This month will be for you the head of the months..." (Shemos 12:2) HaShem commanded that the Hebrew Calendar be established with Nissan, the Month of Pesach, as the first month.

That was the first "Mitzvah," Divine Command, in "Sefer Shemos." We do find a Command to Avraham in "Sefer Bereshis," concerning "Bris Milah," the Covenant of Circumcision, "Every male among you shall be circumcised" (Bereshis 17:10) HaShem created the universe in an imperfect state, desiring that it be perfected. The "Sanhedrin," the Jewish Supreme Court, was given the task of organizing time, such that it would be regulated by the Hebrew Calendar, with its festivals and fasts. And the ceremony of circumcision, helped Man to perfect the human body, by establishing a control on the organ of desire.

Another "Bris," or Covenant, was established at Sinai, where HaShem proposed the arrangement "Now therefore, if you will indeed hearken to My voice, and you will keep My covenant, then you shall be My own treasure from among all the nations; for all the earth is Mine." (Shemos 19:5) And the response of the People of Israel is described, "And all the people answered together, and they said, 'All that HaShem has spoken we will do...' (Shemos 19:8)
