Parashas Shemos – “A Tale of Two Haftaros...”

“...or of Two Prophets.” The allocation of prophetic material between the Ashkenazic and the Sephardic versions of the Haftarah of Parashas Shemos is most unusual because there is no overlap at all between the two versions. Furthermore, the Ashkenazic version is from the words of Yeshayahu HaNavi and the Sephardic version is from the words of Yirmiyahu HaNavi.

The two aforementioned prophets flourished approximately 125 years apart; Yeshayahu's time was approximately 770 BCE – 710 BCE, Yirmiyahu's approximately 640- BCE – 586 BCE; Yeshayahu in the time of the kings Uziah, Yotam, Achaz and Chizkiyahu, Yirmiyahu in the time of the kings Yehoachaz, Yehoyakim, Yehoyachin and Tzidkiyahu, the last king of Yehudah, before the destruction of the First Temple, whose last vision on earth, before he was blinded, was of his sons being killed by the Babylonians.

Yeshayahu reprimanded the Jewish People concerning the issues of social injustice, excessive luxury and relying on foreign powers for military aid instead of upon HaShem, and declared a late warning that if repentance was not on the near national agenda, destruction would not be long in coming. Yirmiyahu decried the prevalent idol worship, the desertion of HaShem and the Torah by the priests and prophets and delivered the final warning to the Jewish People and informed them that if repentance was not immediate and total, then all hope of saving Yerushalayim and the Temple was lost. Yirmiyahu was the prophet who witnessed the destruction and was the author of Megilas Eichah; *“I am the person whose eyes have witnessed the affliction by the rod of His anger.” (Eichah 3:1)*

Links between the Haftaros and Parashas Shemos

Ashkenazic Version: In not so much a link as a direct reference, the Prophet refers to the events in Egypt, when Yaakov came to that country, and the famine immediately ended. The word *“habaim”* “those who came,” is used by the prophet, matching the use of that word in the Chumash, in the first verse of the Parashah, *“V'eleh shemos ha'anashim habaim Mitzraymah...”* *“These are the names of the People who came to Egypt...” (Shemos 1:1)*

“Yatzitz U'Pharach,” *“Sprouted and produced fruit,”* closely resembles *“Paru Va Yishretzu,”* in the Parashah, meaning *“reproduced at a rapid rate.”*

Continuing the references to the Story of the Exodus, Yeshayahu refers to the “Makos,” the “plagues,” in the verse *“Hakemakat makehu hikahu?”* – *“Did He strike you as He struck the ones who struck you?”*

Verse 8, which speaks of a powerful East Wind, alludes to the powerful East Wind that played a major role in the Miracle of the Crossing of the Yam Suf.

Yeshayahu refers to the sin of idol-worship. This was indeed the spiritual state of affairs of the Jewish People in Egypt at that time, prompting the angels to question why HaShem was drowning the Egyptians and not the Jews, since both were idol-worshippers.

Sephardic Version: “Everything written about this one (Moshe) is written about the other one (Yirmiyahu). This one prophesied for forty years, and the other prophesied for forty years, this one was thrown into a river and the other was thrown into a pit; this one gave reproof to the People of Israel, as did the other.” (Pesikta D'Rav Kahane 13:37)

“Before I created you in the womb, I knew you” (Yirmiyahu 1:5); when Yirmiyahu came into the world, he cried a great cry like a much older child, reproving his mother. In the case of Moshe, his cry was also unusual in the same way, *“Vehineh Ha-na'ar bocheh”*, where *“na'ar”* usually refers to an older boy.

Moshe initially refused the summons of HaShem to act as His messenger; Yirmiyahu tried to do the same.

Moshe said *“My mouth and my tongue are heavy”* – Yirmiyahu said, *“I do not know how to speak.”*

Moshe said, *“Who am I?”* Yirmiyahu said, *“I am but a boy.”*

Common link between Yeshayahu and Yirmiyahu and Sefer Shemos: Yeshayahu foresaw the destruction of the Temple; Yirmiyahu saw the destruction. And they both prophesied that in the “Acharis HaYamim,” the Temple will be built yet again. The Ramban says that the theme of Sefer Shemos is the People of Israel rising to the level of the Avos, with whom the Divine Presence was not a stranger, by building the Mishkan, the Portable Temple, which was the Home of the Divine Presence on earth, among the Jewish People.
