Parashas Vaera – A Cup of Blessing

Early in this week's parashah, Parashas Vaera, HaShem says to Moshe, "Wherefore say unto the Children of Israel, 'I am HaShem, 'Veho-Tzaysi Eschem' ('And I shall bring you out') from under the burdens of the Egyptians, 'Vehi-Tzalti Eschem' ('And I shall save you') from their bondage, 'Vego-Alti Eschem' ('And I shall redeem you') with an outstretched arm and with great judgments, 'Velo-Kachti Eschem' Li lo-Am ('And I shall take you to Myself as a People') and I will be to you as a G-d'..." (Shemos 6:6-7) The underlined are the "Four Expressions of Redemption," which are one of the explanations why four cups of wine are drunk on the inspiring evening of the Pesach Seder. A blessing is recited over each cup; therefore the Four Cups of the Seder are also Four Cups of Blessing.

This past Sunday night, I had the pleasure of attending the annual dinner of "Tomchei Shabbos." The highlight for me was the speech delivered by my friend, Paysach Krohn. Now my first contact with Paysach was many long years ago, when we both played on the Camp Agudah Softball Team. Paysach played shortstop and I played first base. He had good hands even then. Since then, he has gone far beyond the softball field. After the tragic "petirah" of his father at the age of 47, Paysach took his place and served as a "mohel" for some forty years, and passed on this sacred tradition to his own son. But great as that achievement was, he also had the good fortune of a close and fruitful association with Rav Shlomo Schwadron, ZT"l, the "Maggid of Yerushalayim." Paysach had the ingenious idea of translating the works of the "Maggid" into English, for the benefit of western audiences. The idea took off like wildfire. He has written eight works in the "Maggid" series, the most recent being "In the Splendor of the Maggid," and his inspiring words as a speaker have gained for him a worldwide audience. In his speech, one of the stories that he told, which corresponded to the first entry in his most recent work, was "A Cup of Blessing."

The story begins, "Young Yisroel Rosenfeld was only 15 years old, but he viewed the future with a sense of foreboding." He lived with his family in the ghetto of Chust in Czechoslovakia, then occupied by Hungary. Rumors were rampant that the ghetto was about to be liquidated, and the entire population would be deported. Yisroel ran to his grandmother's house and buried four precious items in the backyard: his father's pocket watch, his mother's two candlesticks, the "atarah" from his father's "tallis," and most precious of all, the "becher" that the Satmar Rebbe, Rabbi Yoel Teitelbaum, gave his parents when he married them in Chust. Two days later, the entire ghetto was liquidated, and deported to Auschwitz. Yisroel managed to survive his year and a half in the hell of Auschwitz, though, sadly, his parents did not. After the liberation, he determined to retrieve the buried items. Amazingly, he was able to find them. The "becher" was flattened due to being trampled upon in the soft earth, but a silversmith was able to bring it back to life.

He emigrated to America and became a "rebbe" in the Hillel Academy in Denver, Colorado. Paysach's wife, Miriam, was one of his students for several years (he always taught the highest grade). When Paysach and Miriam were engaged, the friendship between the families blossomed. Years later, Paysach performed "brissen" for a number of the Rosenfeld grandsons. In June, 2012, Rabbi Rosenfeld came to NY to celebrate the "bris" of his first great-grandson. He would be the "sandek" and Paysach would be the "mohel." On the morning of the "bris," Rav Rosenfeld told Paysach, "We have used this 'becher' for every 'bris' and wedding in our family, since I retrieved it. Today marks a milestone in our family. It is the first time that we are using the 'becher' for a fifth generation child..."

In general, Paysach writes, he does not speak before a "bris." But the inspirational quality of this cup needed to be explained to all the guests, "This 'becher' symbolizes our Jewish nation. We may be trampled on for years, other nations may have given us up for dead, but in the end, it is we as a nation who survive and outlive our adversaries. This 'becher' is truly a 'cup of blessing.'"

There are certain individuals in the Jewish community who deserve, because of their overflowing kindness, to be considered a "cup of blessing." Paysach Krohn is such a person.
