## Parashas Vayekhel-Pikudei – Daf-Yomi, and Around Manhattan

(Much of the material in this essay is translated from "Ma'ayan Bais HaSho'evah," by Rabbi Shimon Schwab, ZT"L)

World-wide Day-Yomi groups are approaching a Siyum on Maseches Shabbos. Next in line is Maseches Eruvin, which has a reputation of not being among the easiest masechtos; in fact, along with Maseches Yevamos, it is considered to be a masechta which "separates the men from the boys." Interestingly, "Eruvin" is also indirectly a subject of Parashas VaYakhel.

Chaza"l ask, on Shabbos 96b, "Where is the Melachoh of 'Hotza'ah,' 'Taking Out,' alluded to in the Torah?" The answer given is that it is in Parashas VaYakhel, in the verse where Moshe commands the Children of Israel to refrain from "bringing," which encompasses the Melachah of "Hotza'ah," "Taking objects from 'Reshus HaYachid,' a 'Private Domain' into 'Reshus HaRabim,' the 'Public Domain' " or vice versa, and "Ha'avarah," "Carrying objects in the 'Public Domain.' "

Both of the above "Melachos" are called "Melachos Geru'os," "Inferior Melachos," because neither involves the creation of something new, but rather only moving of an object from place to place.

Rabbi Schwab cites Rabbi Samson Rephoel Hirsch's logical connection between the Shabbos Command of the Ten Utterances in Parashas Yisro and the Shabbos Command in the Ten Utterances of Parashas Vaeschanan, with the two types of Melachah. In Yisro, we find the creative Melachos are prohibited on Shabbos because of verse "For in Six Days HaShem created Heaven and Earth and He rested on the Seventh Day" (Shemos 20:11). Whereas "Taking Out" and "Carrying in the Public Domain" are prohibited in Vaeschanan by the verse "And you shall remember that you were a slave in Egypt, and HaShem took you out from there..." (Devarim 5:15) The idea of a "Holy Day of Rest" is an invention of the Torah. A slave knew of no opportunity to move in and out freely from his slave quarters, nor was he able to engage in social intercourse by moving from place to place to be with his friends in the slaves' quarters.

A further development of this is based on the idea that Shabbos was given only to the Jewish People. This corresponds to the idea of "Reshus HaYachid," the "Private Domain," separated and apart from humanity in general, which inhabits the "Reshus HaRabim," the "Public Domain." Thus, the Holiness of Shabbos is not in the "Public Domain," and the Torah prohibits taking something rooted in Holiness and moving it into a domain that lacks Holiness, and also moving one's possessions and oneself around in a domain that lacks Holiness.

Rabbi Schwab goes on to cite a letter he wrote around 1964 to the editor of HaPardes. He writes that he read in HaPardes a long essay, the gist of which it was to advocate constructing an Eruv around Manhattan. He writes that he doesn't wish to be negative; rather, he wishes to express a fear that he has concerning the unintended consequences of such a project.

He fears misunderstanding and inappropriate extension of the Eruv, which, since Manhattan is in fact an island, surrounded on all sides by ocean bays and rivers, does not really need an Eruv, except for a technical agreement with city officials. He fears that people not that sophisticated or knowledgeable in Halachah will extend the idea of permissibility of carrying on Shabbos to other boroughs of New York City, in the mistaken idea that the Eruv applies to them as well, and also, since the boroughs are connected by bridges, by walking over the bridges, individuals would be moving from an area where carrying is permitted (Manhattan, with or without an Eruv) to areas (like Brooklyn and the Bronx) where carrying is prohibited.
