Parashas Shmini— “Dayenu” – “It would have been enough for us”

The parashah of the week begins, “*It was on the eighth day...*” (Vayikra 9:1), on which Rashi comments, “the eighth day of the inauguration of the ‘Mishkan,’ which was ‘Rosh Chodesh Nissan,’ the very day on which the ‘Mishkan’ was erected...” Now the ‘Mishkan’ was the predecessor of the “Bais HaMikdash,” the Holy Temple, also known as the “Bais HaBechirah,” the House Reflecting the Chosenness of the Jewish People.

On the Pesach just past, one of the popular Songs of Gratitude to HaShem sung at the Seder was “Dayenu,” “It would have been enough for us.” It is a list of fourteen great miracles performed for us by HaShem. The song begins as follows:

“If He had **only** taken us out of Mitzrayim, but not punished the Egyptians, it would have been enough for us.” This can be explained by the thought that we were really not interested in the punishment of the Egyptians, and would have been just as happy if they didn’t have to suffer. HaShem’s angels, in fact, were puzzled as to why the Egyptians were being punished, and the Israelites weren’t, inasmuch as the two were idol-worshippers.

Another stanza goes like this: “If He had only punished their gods, but not killed their first-born, that would have been enough for us.” Surely the tenth plague caused so much suffering, it is beyond imagining, and were it not a necessary blow, we would gladly have done without it.

Two other stanzas read as follows: “Had He **only** split the sea for us, and not allowed us to cross on dry land, it would have been enough for us.” – “If He would only have allowed us to cross the sea on dry land, but not drowned our enemies in the sea, it would have been enough for us.” The sight of those awesome miracles should have given our enemies pause, but they chose otherwise.

“If He would **only** have given us the Shabbos, but not brought us near to Mt Sinai, **that** would have been enough for us.” The Holy Day of Rest, modeled after the Creation of the Universe and commemorating the Exodus of the Jews from Egypt, from which no other nation had ever escaped, **should surely** have been enough for us!

“If He had given us the Torah, but not allowed us into the Holy Land of Israel, that would certainly have been enough for us.” Our receipt of the Torah is what qualified us for Spiritual Freedom, over and above Physical Freedom.

“If He had brought us into Israel, but not allowed us to build the ‘Bais HaBechirah,’ that would have been enough for us.”

And that is the **last stanza**. Apparently, the building of the “Bais HaMikdash,” or the “Bais HaBechirah” in the time of the ‘Moshiach’ is the highest possible goal for humanity. A nation at one with the “Shechinah,” the Divine Presence, returning to the level of the ‘Avos,’ the goal the Ramban said was the goal of Sefer Shemos, was also the goal for humanity that its Creator had in Mind from the First.

As we conclude each night the Sephirat HaOmer, between the second day of Pesach and Shavuos, “May the Merciful One return the worship of the ‘Bais HaMikdash’ soon and in our days.”

And as we conclude each “Shemoneh Esray,” “May it be Your Will, HaShem, our G-d and the G-d of our fathers, that the ‘Bais HaMikdash’ be built soon and in our days... And there let us worship You as in ancient days and the earliest years, and let the Minchah Sacrifice of Yehudah and Yerushalayim be pleasing to You again as in the ancient days and the earliest years.”
