## Parashios Tazria -Metzora – Good Seeding, Good Speech and a Good Life

I read a book recently entitled "As Long as I Live – The Life Story of Aharon Margalit." The theme of the book is "Chizuk," Encouragement. In the Preface, the author writes, "As long as I live, I will never forget the vicissitudes of my life, nor will I cease to share the story of my trials, miracles and triumphs. I will continue to seek the spark that is ignited in the eyes of listeners and readers, when they are drawn into my story and glean the lessons learned from my experiences. As long as I live, that will be my life's mission..."

The author contended with the traumatic incident of being run over by a tractor at the age of three on a 'moshav' which left him mute, which subsequently led to a profound stutter. He then contracted polio, one of the nightmarish diseases of those years. The author, totally paralyzed, was imprisoned in an 'iron lung' for several years. When recovering from this paralysis, he was given physical therapy by his mother, which he describes as follows:

"And so, with immeasurable dedication, my dear mother worked tirelessly to revive each and every muscle in every limb of my body...Refusing to despair in the face of the immense task before her, Ima worked on me from head to toe, finger after finger, limb by limb, with pulling, pressing, chopping motions of her skilled hands. My body writhed in agony; tears bathed my face...And Ima, who was stronger than anyone, would cry together with me, her tears falling onto me...'I promise you, the day will come when we'll play tag here in the yard, and you'll catch me! Yes! You'll catch me, my Ahre'le...I was comforted. If Ima promised, it would come true...Even as I screamed and cried bitter tears from the pain, I gnashed my teeth but continued to strive toward my goal. Ima had promised; my goal was within reach."

Margalit describes each struggle he underwent:

With the speech therapist who helped eliminate his stutter

His tumultuous battle with a malignant tumor, a sarcoma, that appeared on his cheek. Pesach followed the operation, and he insisted on celebrating the Seder with his family; "When we reached Hallel, I began to understand what Abba used to tell us about his Seder in the Hungarian prison. All my bones were dancing; every fiber, every cell in my body was singing a song of life. I had gone forth from darkness to light, from grief to rejoicing, from sorrow to Yom Tov. *'He lifts the pauper up from the dust! He raises up the needy from the dung heap!'*...Now I danced like a ram and frolicked like a lamb before HaShem, Who had transformed my hardships, though unyielding as a flint-stone, into wellsprings of life."

Margalit was visited again by cancer, for which the treatment was chemotherapy. He makes no pretense of minimizing the severity of the chemo. But he does write, "I ask forgiveness from my not-yet-religious friends and acquaintances, but the truth must be told. In the treatment room, a major difference can be seen between the believers and the self-professed non-believers. A person with "emunah" draws strength from that faith, relying on HaShem through a spirit of optimism. By contrast, those lacking in "emunah" often fail to find a source of hope. Often, it is from this place that they begin to seek faith."

Aharon breaks down his approach into five axioms:

"The 'Ribbono shel Olam' can do anything. No one can tell Him what to do.

He created the world for the purpose of doing good to His creations, because it's the way of One Who is good to do good.

Since "HaShem" can do anything, and since the goal is to do good to his creations, and since I, too, am His creation, that means that included in "Hashem's" ultimate purpose is to do good to me, Aharon Margalit. I too am created in His image.

Now that it's clear to me that "HaShem" can do anything, that His purpose is to do good, and that He will do only good to me, I am in the category of a believing Jew. Only in You, "Ribbono shel Olam" do I trust. Only in Your kindness do I hope.

According to the measure of a person's faith, so is the measure of the abundant blessings he receives. According to the measure of his trust is the measure of kindness he receives. Faith draws forth blessing; the more faith I can muster, the more divine abundance I will draw forth. Faith is like a pipeline, or conduit. The wider it is, the more it can contain and convey."
