Parashas Emor ""Yom HaAtzmaus" – A Complex Birthday

My Bar-Mitzvah was celebrated on this Shabbos, Shabbos Parashas Emor. My Hebrew Birthday is 7 lyar, 1946. Yom HaAtzmaus is 5 lyar, 1948. However, I have always been proud of the proximity between my entry into the world and that of the State of Israel. I see our time as a historic one, one in which our national homeland has blossomed from a barren land of malarial swamps, deserts and emptiness, into a beautiful land of greenery, yeshivos, and universities. Historically, I see our time period as one of "Kibbutz Galuyos," and of "Aschalta DeGeulah," the "Beginning of the Redemption of the Jewish People."

I attended the elementary school "Yeshivas Rabbeinu Moshe Soloveitchik," a very worthy feeder school to Yeshiva University High School for Boys. Our principal was Rabbi Yitzchok HaKohen Weinberg, a strong Religious Zionist, our language of instruction in religious studies was "Ivris," "LeShon HaKodesh," the language of the Torah and of the Prophets. My parents were also Religious Zionists, and my upbringing and adulthood and family life have been lived in the spirit of that movement.

What is the complexity referred to in the title of this article? I believe it is a multifaceted one. The least important one of which can be found in the neighborhood in which I grew up: Washington Heights. On the other side of town was the Breuer's Kehillah. This was a religious community, similar to mine, except in a nuance of its relationship to "Eretz Yisrael." They viewed the fact that the early pioneers of life in Israel were not strictly Orthodox in a harsher light than my community did. However, there are now quite a few yeshivas from the Breuer Kehillah gracing the Land of Israel, and good friendships exist in the communities outside of the Holy Land, which suggests that a quick end to this aspect of the problem is not far away.

Another aspect of the problem is the problematic relationship between the "Charedi" (Ultra-Orthodox) and the "Dati" (Regular Orthodox) Kehillos. The latter attend yeshivos, then do army service, after which they attend university or enter the work force. The Charedi community has historically not served in the army, attended university, or participated in the work force, which is resented by the other members of the Orthodox (and Secular) worlds. The historical root of this problem lies at the beginning of the state, when early leaders (such as David Ben Gurion) felt that the Charedi community would not last long in the modern world. History has proved him very much wrong in that assumption. There has been some movement in the direction of rectification of this problem, but there is a long way to go.

Of course there is the continuing hostility between the "Chiloni" (secular) and the "Dati" (religious) communities. But with the participation of Yeshiva students in high positions in the army and the constructive role they play in other areas of modern Israeli society, there is good evidence that this problem as well is beginning to abate. As there is more and more participation of Torah Law in the modern world (there was a particularly beautiful role played by a surgeon named Dr. Applebaum, who was responsible for much "Kiddush HaShem" (Sanctification of God's Name) until he and his daughter were murdered by Arab terrorists on the eve of her wedding) that there is a sense of the Return of the Divine Presence to the Holy Land and the Holy People.
