Parashas Bamidbar "Jewish Destiny; Menachem Begin and Rabbi Berel Wein"

Recently, we celebrated "Yom HaAtzma'us," Israel Independence Day and "Yom Yerushalayim," the Anniversary of the Day that the Israel Defense Forces, with the help of HaShem, unified Yerushalayim during the Six Day War. This essay discusses two great individuals who have had an impact on Jewish Destiny: Menachem Begin, who as head of the Irgun, led the revolt against the British, which led to the proclamation of an independent State of Israel, and Rabbi Berel Wein, who has played and continues to play a major role in the return of the Jewish People to its tradition.

Menachem Begin witnessed and experienced the Holocaust, one of the blackest periods in Jewish History, about which one is permitted to ask questions, but can expect no answers. He experienced the suffering of the Jewish People in full measure, but maintained his faith in his Creator and in his People. Born in Brest-Litovsk in 1913, he became familiar with the classic Jewish sources: the Bible, the Mishnah, the Gemara, and the Siddur. He became intimately familiar with Jewish History. A passionate Zionist from his youth, he joined Z'ev Jabotinsky's Betar Youth Movement in his teens, becoming the leader of Betar of Poland, an organization of 100,000 members, organized to defend Polish Jewry and to help provide the transport of "illegal" immigrants to Israel. Begin became the head of the "Irgun Z'vai Leumi," the National Military Organization that confronted the British, in their attempts to suppress Jewish immigration to Palestine after the Holocaust. He organized the Akko prison breakout and the destruction of the central administrative offices of the British at the King David Hotel, after providing early warning to the British so that they could save their lives. When he was pursued by the British, he assumed the disguise of a rabbi, which one might say was his true identity. He led the opposition party in the Israeli government for 29 years, until he became Prime Minister in 1977. One of his diplomatic achievements was his initiation of the "peace process" with Egypt, which one day may bear fruit. One of his greatest acts as Prime Minister was ordering the destruction by the Israeli Air Force of the Iraqi nuclear reactor inn Osiraq in 1981, an act that saved the world from calamity at the hands of a roque nuclear power, an act which was, naturally, roundly condemned by the United Nations. When he spoke at the U.N., his lips flowed with the poetry of the Bible, regarding Jewish Destiny and World Peace.

Rabbi Berel Wein is a master Rabbi, a master rebbe, a master speaker, a master writer, a master educator, a master at whatever field he chooses to enter. Most of all, with all these talents, he has a broad eye and a broad mind, a superb sense of history, a wonderful perspective on life, and a profound sense of gratitude to parents and teachers. He has traveled the world, and his teachings have reached many thousands, nay hundreds of thousands, of students. He is founder and director of the Destiny Foundation. He was community rabbi in Miami Beach, Monsey and Jerusalem. He was Kashrus Director for the O.U. He was founder and Rosh HaYeshiva for Yeshivas Sha'arei Torah in Monsey. He was the creator of hundreds of Jewish History tapes. He wrote at least 8 books in English, and 2 in Hebrew. He was the creative force behind two movies, biographies of Rashi and the Rambam.

At the end of "Teach them Diligently," he writes, "In my lifetime, I have seen the Jewish People at its lowest point, immediately after the Second World War and the Holocaust. Had someone told me then that I would someday be a rabbi in Jerusalem, the capital of a Jewish state – and live to see the miracles that the existence and strength of that state represents – I would have been very skeptical. But never doubt the fulfillment of the eternal Jewish dream. Surely I have lived through one of the great historic chapters of the ages... There is ample reason to believe that the Lord Who has seen us through this far will see us to our complete redemption as well."
