Parashas Ki-Savo – “Shenas HaShemittah” - The Shabbos of the Land

On Shabbos Parashas Ki-Savo, Congregation Bais Torah had the distinct pleasure of hosting Rabbi Steven Weil, Senior Managing Director of the Orthodox Union as our Scholar-in-Residence. He addressed the congregation on Friday night, Shabbos morning, afternoon, Seudah Shelishis and, on Motzaei Shabbos, on “After the Apocalypse: The Orthodox Response to Jewish Assimilation in America.”

On this Shabbos, we read Parashios Nitzavim and Vayelech. These are two parashios which could be said to be the text for Moshe Rabbeinu's “Shabbos Shuvah” Drashah. We find: “*And you will return to HaShem, your God, and listen to His Voice, according to everything that I command you today, you and your children, with all your heart and all your soul. Then HaShem, your God, will bring back your captivity and have mercy upon you, and He will gather you in from all the peoples to which HaShem, your God, had scattered you.*” (Devarim 30:2-3)

“*It is not in Heaven [for you] to say, ‘Who can ascend to Heaven for us and take it for us, so that we can listen to it and perform it?’...Rather, the matter is very near to you – in your mouth and in your heart – to perform it.*” (Devarim 30:12,14)

Rabbi Weil began by introducing the Pew Survey, which had compared the three branches of Judaism in the United States with respect to probable longevity, and found that Orthodox Judaism was the best of the three, but only with fair expectations. The other two, Reform and Conservative Judaism, had results which ranged from “poor” to “terrible.” It was good that we had out-performed the other branches but Rabbi Weil offered suggestions as to how we could improve our numbers.

He first introduced the “Birthright” Program, which he said had taken juniors in high school, to catch them before they made the decision which college to attend, with very low interest in Israel and, by exposing them to the people and the reality of Israel, had turned many in the group around, in terms of their identification with Israel.

He explored ways in which we might be able to kindle more positive interest in Israel:

Shabbos: “Don’t invite friends for Friday night.” Instead, invite those in your circle of friends who were disengaged from Israel. Show them how a family can sing together, discuss issues of substance, not necessarily Divrei Torah, but Judaism’s perspective on world events. How Shabbos can upgrade a human being by providing him or her with a “day off” (without cell-phones).

Pesach: Be careful; because people are not necessarily familiar with the Chazon Ish’s shiurim for matzoh and marror. Serve good food and discuss the **idea of freedom**, without 100% adherence to the Haggadah.

Shavuos: Invite friends to an all-night lecture gig. Or stage one yourself. Serve cheesecake and blintzes.

Succos: Talk about the four species and God’s mastery of the universe. Speak about the meaning of Succos, in terms of God’s protection of Israel, by Clouds of Glory or actual succos.

Purim: Invite friends from your social spectrum to your Purim Seudah. Bet they’ve never seen rabbis in costume!

Chanukah: Invite, again, selection of friends and acquaintances. Talk about history of Chanukah, meaning of light, role of women, dreidel, Macabim and military elephants.

He mentioned a friend and a former classmate of mine, Rabbi Ephraim Z. Buchwald, a creative fellow who has basically devoted his life to Outreach (he’s the founder of NJOP – National Jewish Outreach Program), who has, unbelievably, reached more than a million Jews, using such techniques as Beginner Hebrew classes and “Introduction to Prayer” Minyonim.
