Parashas Vayikrah

Translations of Rabbi Shimon Schwab's Divrei Torah

(Two Selections from Ma'ayan Beis HaSho'evah)

1. "Vayikra el Moshe..." – "And HaShem called to Moshe..." (Vayikra 1:1)

And in the Midrash Vayikra Rabati (1:6) Rabbi Tanchuma began to speak regarding the following verse: 'There is gold and many pearls, but lips of wisdom are a precious vessel' – It is an ordinary occurrence that a person has gold and silver, precious stones and many pearls, and all the precious vessels in the world, and all the riches, but he has no understanding of what he has...; 'There is gold' – Everyone brought their donation of gold to the Mishkan...

'And many pearls' – This was the donation of the princes...

'But he has no understanding of what he has' – This refers to Moshe Rabbeinu, because Moshe was depressed, as he said to himself, 'Everyone brought a donation to the Mishkan except me.' The Holy One, Blessed be He, said to him, 'By your life! Your speech is more precious to Me than everything, for to no one of all of them was My speech granted besides you, as it says, 'And HaShem called to Moshe.' "

"To understand why in truth, Moshe did not bring a donation for the Mishkan, for indeed, everyone else had brought something, and how could it be that Moshe refrained from likewise donating, it is possible to answer, in the understanding of the verse, 'Speak to the children of Israel and take from them a donation for Me' (Shemos 25:2), which indicates that the command to Moshe Rabbeinu was that he should speak and they should bring, and permission was granted to donate to the Mishkan only in response to the command of Moshe. And Moshe was not included among those to whom the command 'and let them take a donation for Me' was addressed, for his speech was more precious in the eyes of the Holy One, Blessed be He.' "

2. "Speak to the Children of Israel...ADAM, if he offers from among you a sacrifice to HaShem..." (Vayikra 1:2)

"Rashi asks, 'Why was Adam, the first man, mentioned?' And he answers, 'Just as Adam didn't sacrifice from that which was stolen, for everything was his, you as well should not sacrifice from that which was stolen.' (See Vayikra Rabbah 2:7) But this is difficult to understand! You say that everything was his, and therefore, it was impossible for him to steal from someone else; but what then is the proof for us, where personal property is the norm. Can one infer a case of possible from a case of the impossible! "

"So it is clear that the Torah's concern was not that the person bringing the sacrifice bring it from his own, and not from another's property, for, from the perspective of HaShem, in either case, the property is His! Rather, the problem with stolen objects is that they are not the property of the one bringing the sacrifice! And therefore they fail to meet the standard of returning something to the One Who had given it to you. The essence of a sacrifice is that the human being return to the Holy One, Blessed be He, so to speak, from that which he received from Him. In this case, the sacrifice fails to meet the standard of 'for everything is Yours, and from Your Hand, do we return it to You' (Divrei HaYamim (1:(29:14)) – and, if he sacrificed from stolen material, he is not returning what he received from the Holy One, Blessed be He."
