Parashas Ki TzeTze Rav Schwab's Siyum on Sefer Iyov

In Parashas Bereshis, when First Man was created, HaShem saw that he was lonely. He decided to create a partner, an "Ezer K'negdo," for Man, with whom he could work in an efficient and happy manner. Of course, the interaction of the sexes is anything but a simple matter. Each "partner" has an independent personality working against a background of strong mutual attraction. Parashas KiSetze teaches many Mitzvos, many having to do with the relationship between man and woman.

The parashah opens with a discussion of the "eishes yefas toar," the beautiful captive, the reaction to her by the soldier, whose passions have been freed for battle, to a beautiful woman among the captives. Other nations have allowed their armies to travel the path of rape in similar circumstances. But the Torah endeavors to instill restraint in the fighting forces of Israel. Therefore, a 30-day period is allowed for the beautiful captive to mourn for her parents and to mitigate her appearance, by cutting her hair, letting her nails grow long, and wearing unattractive clothing. Afterwards, the soldier, if he so desires, may live with her, and take her for a wife.

The Torah follows the discussion of this case with two likely results of such a marriage. The first involves two wives, one loved, the other, less loved, (Devarim 21:15). Boys are born to each of the wives, the first to the less-loved; the second to the loved. The husband, of course wants to give the larger portion of his estate to the son of the more beloved wife, which is against the Law of the Torah. The next likely result of the marriage is the "Ben Sorer U-Morah," the birth of a totally undisciplined, wild son, disobedient in the extreme. His fate is to be stoned to death (Devarim 21:21).

The Torah frowns upon the indiscriminate mixing of the sexes, as it says, "The garments of a male should not be worn by a woman, and the garments of a female should not be worn by a male, for such behavior is an abomination in the eyes of HaShem." (Devarim 22:5)

The following was a great advance by the Torah. The Torah states the following: "If a man takes a woman, and lives with her, and if she does not find favor in his eyes, for he has found something highly improper in her behavior; he should write a document of divorce and place it in her hand, and send her out of his house. She then should leave his house and attempt to find another husband." (Devarim 24:1-2) The Torah does not allow a bad situation to deteriorate further.

On the positive side, the Torah declares, "If a man takes a new wife, he should not enter the army to serve in any way; he should be free to remain at home for a full year, and rejoice with his new wife." (Devarim 24:5)

The Torah wishes to teach a lesson regarding negative speech, and it does so using the greatest characters. Moshe, the greatest prophet, did not know when HaShem would appear to him; therefore, he was forced to leave his wife. Miriam, the greatest female prophet, did not fully appreciate Moshe's greatness, and felt great sympathy for Tziporah, Moshe's wife. Ha-Shem punished her with leprosy, for speaking ill of Moshe to Aharon. Moshe, upon witnessing this, prayed to HaShem to heal her. We learn that we have to be extremely careful in forming judgments of people.
