Parashas Noach - "Tamim Be-Dorosav" – Perfect in His Generation

(The following are translations from Hebrew to English of two short essays by the Rav of K'hal Adas Yeshurun, Rav Shimon Schwab, ZT"L)

"'This is the history of Noach; Noach was a righteous man, perfect in his generation; he went with the Almighty.' (Bereshis 6:9)

'And Rashi (Based on Bereshis Rabbah 30:9) comments on the words, 'in his generation' - 'Some of our Rabbis interpret this to Noach's credit, as follows: 'If he had lived in a righteous generation, he would have been even more righteous! And some interpret the words to his discredit: 'As compared to the rest of his generation, he could be considered righteous, but if he had lived in the generation of Avraham, he would not have been considered as 'anything special.' But this requires explanation. How is it possible that in the generation of Avraham, he would not have been considered as 'anything special?' Does not the Torah testify regarding him that he was perfectly righteous? And also, from him the world began anew! And even if he did not reach the level of Avraham, he was certainly an important and righteous man!'

'And in truth, here the child asks, 'How is it possible that a perfectly righteous man who lived 600 years until the Flood, could not have had any effect on the people in his generation, in trying to convince them to join him under the wings of the Divine Presence? And they had observed him working on the Ark for 120 years, at the command of God, to escape the punishment planned for an unrepentant generation. How was it that it had not occurred to anybody to repent? Yet we do not find anyone entering the Ark except Noach and his family!'

'We see from this that even though Noach was perfectly righteous, he did not concern himself with the task of 'bringing near' those who were far away, making known to all of humanity that there was a 'manhig ha-birah,' a 'supervisor of the palace,' and if he had devoted himself to this cause, he certainly could have saved many from the Flood. And this is Rashi's intention by the expression in the manner of his generation he was righteous;' meaning that as others in his generation were not concerned about others at all, similarly, Noach's only concern was regarding his own pursuits. Except that while others in his generation lusted after physical attainments, Noach desired his own and his family's spiritual growth.' "

" 'Noach, the man of the earth, debased himself and planted a vineyard. He drank of the wine and became drunk, and he uncovered himself within his tent.'

'It is necessary to analyze why did Noach drink the wine and also, why did he strip himself naked within his tent. Did not the Torah testify regarding him that he was a perfectly righteous man, and if so, even though he had become intoxicated, he should have restrained himself from performing a disgusting act! And the proof is that after he recovered from his drunkenness, he prophesied a great prophecy regarding the future of Shem, Chom and Yefes (verses 25-27); thus Noach remained in a state of greatness. It is also necessary to understand why the Torah calls him the 'man of the earth.'

Perhaps it is possible to say that Noach thought that the Flood had destroyed all evil from the world, and that after the Flood, the world was in a state of perfection as it was before the first sin, and that he had reached the level of 'man of the earth,' and that he was like First Man, who was created from the earth. And that is why he planted a vineyard, and drank wine, on the assumption that he could no longer stumble in sin, and in this manner correct First Man's sin of eating from the 'Tree of Knowledge' (according to the opinion in Sanhedrin 70a that the 'Tree of Knowledge' was a grapevine). And for this reason, he stripped himself naked in his drunkenness, for it seemed to him that he had reached the level of (Bereshis 2:25) 'And the two of them were naked' and there was no longer any need to cover one's nakedness, as before the sin of the First Man.' "
