Parashas Tazria— Jewish Politics

When I was a young boy, growing up in Washington Heights, a favorite activity on Shabbos for the parents was to go to the park and discuss politics and current events with their friends and neighbors. This was especially true at election time. And it was especially true when there was a contest between a military hero, who was not a notable intellectual and an individual who was not only intellectually superior but also of a superior moral bent.

Now, as an astute political "maven," I had made up my mind as to who the superior candidate was. Clearly it was General Dwight David Eisenhower, the commander of American forces in Korea, a Republican, who towered over Senator Adlai Stevenson, a Democrat, with no particular military experience. I tried to get my mother to admit that she favored Stevenson, but she steadfastly refused to admit that truth, claiming there was something called a "secret ballot," and knowing that her preference would instantly be made known to all the people in the park.

My mother's career was a career in friendship and giving. She worked for the N.Y.C. Bd. of Ed. – first in teaching, then as a secretary. She spoke of friendly relations with colleagues, and with a nun. After hours, she brought dinner to my father and helped him in his store. She insisted that my brother remain in Israel after the "petirah" of my father in 1960. She took a group of my friends to the park to play ball, and taught us sportsmanship.

In terms of politics, one of the members of our Young Israel said that he would have voted for my father for mayor. In "shul," he was an excellent "Ba'al Tefilah" and "Ba'al Koreh." His "Pesach Sedorim" were awe-inspiring. The only problem was the "Marror," which was exclusively horseradish in the pre-Romaine Lettuce period, and caused me to retreat to a position under the table. He taught my older brother and myself "davening" and "layening" and gave our friend "Bar Mitzvah" lessons for free. He took the family frequently to attractions in N.Y. City. An excellent skater, who had ice-skated to school in Europe, he lovingly skated with my mother in the Central Park rink.

In his store, he was generous to a fault with all members of the community, Jewish and non-Jewish. He was an expert at repairing all sorts of household appliances, a service which he provided gratis to everyone who needed it. His "shemiras Shabbos" caused wide-spread admiration throughout the German community of Washington Heights. Many a time did I meet a former resident of Washington Heights in Monsey, who remembered my father's store for that reason.

Having learned Torah copiously in his youth in Hungary, my father came to the United States as a "Talmid Chochom." I remember lovingly "Chumash" lessons in "Bereshis" when I had to stay home from "Yeshiva." He learned in a "chabura" with Rav Huttner, and was considered for a time a candidate for a position as a "maggid shiur" at Chaim Berlin.

But when he came to the U.S. he had to bring his family from Hungary to these shores. He fell in love with my mother, whose origin was Vilna in Poland, and who'd immigrated to the U.S. at the tender age of nine months, as the youngest of her siblings. Her family tried Gloversville, N.Y. but her father could not find Shabbos-friendly employment there. Her father then uttered the famous words "Is Gloversville all of America?" The family moved to N.Y.C. where her father found employment at the Uptown Talmud Torah, and gave "Bar-Mitzvah" lessons to thousands of boys there. And the rest is history.
