## Parashas Kedoshim 70th Birthday (for Mature Wisdom (?)) (GR" A)

Last Shabbos, on May 7, I celebrated my 70<sup>th</sup> birthday, and much of my family came to Monsey on Sunday to celebrate the happy occasion. My brother's family gave me a nice present, a "sefer" called "Seder Yesodei HaTorah," written by Rav Aharon Sheraige Lopiansky, a collection of essays on the Parashios HaShavua. I've selected one of these essays from the group on Parashas Kedoshim.

*"Do not curse a deaf person and before a blind person do not place an obstacle; and you shall fear your Lord, I am HaShem."* (Vayikra 19:14)

(“Sub-title: The prohibition against cursing someone is also for the benefit of the one who uttered the curse.”)

“This refers to the Torah’s prohibition against cursing a deaf person, but the intention of the Torah here is not only to prohibit cursing the deaf, for it says (Sifra, 2), “How do we know that the prohibition is against cursing anyone? To teach us that lesson, the Torah writes, ‘Against anyone of your nation, you shall not utter a curse.’ (Shemos 22:27)”

“The intention here is that when an individual is stirred to seek revenge against someone who has damaged him, according to the imagined injury, human nature is such that it will not be satisfied until the same imagined injury is inflicted upon the damaging party (‘measure for measure’) and once that is accomplished, then the injured party can relax and let go of the tormenting image of the imagined injury. Sometimes, it will be sufficient to satisfy the desire for vengeance, by uttering curses against the damaging party, with the same intensity that he inflicted upon the injured party. And sometimes, the matter is more serious, and that image will not depart until the aggressor is actually removed from existence, and that is his desire. And sometimes the injury is so slight that no punishment at all is required of the damaging party. And this is the case when the injury is so slight that its image goes away with just words.”

“And lest we think that the reason for the Torah’s prohibition against cursing a fellow Jew, is that the reason for the emotional injury that is caused by his hearing the words of the curse, this would not apply in the case where the cursed individual is deaf! Therefore, we are forced to the conclusion that the Torah is concerned not only about the one who receives the curse, but also about the one who utters it, lest he become accustomed to taking revenge by means of his words, and by means of this restraint, he will change his nature, inclining it from excessive sensitivity to excessive calmness.”

(Teachings of the Ra"n, Teaching 12)
