Parashas Nitzavim – The Eternal Covenant Between HaShem and Israel As Verified by Modern Technology

On the last day of his life, Moshe Rabbeinu charges his nation as follows: "You are standing today, all of you, before HaShem, your God: the heads of your tribes, your elders and your officers – all the men of Israel." (Devarim 29:9) Rashi comments that Moshe was here, for the last time, initiating the men of Israel into a "bris," a covenant with God. What was new about this covenant was the concept of "arvus," mutual responsibility; every Jew is obligated to help other Jews to observe the Torah and not to violate it.

"Not with you alone do I seal this covenant and this warning, but with whoever is here, standing with us today, before HaShem, our God, and with whoever is not here with us today." (Devarim 29:13-14) This covenant is obligatory upon all Jews, for all generations, and for all time.

"You shall return and listen to the voice of HaShem...when HaShem will return to rejoice over you for good, as He rejoiced over your forefathers...when you shall return to HaShem, your God, with all your heart and all your soul." (Devarim 30: 8-10) "Teshuvah," "Return to one another" is a mutual process, but requires full participation, on the part of HaShem, and on the part of the Jew.

"For the commandment that I command you - it is not hidden from you and it is not distant... Rather, the matter is very near to you - in your mouth and in your heart - to perform it." (Devarim 30:11, 14) Understanding the Torah is very difficult, but by the application of supreme effort, it is well within reach of human beings to accomplish its demands.

"I call heaven and earth today to bear witness against you. I have placed life and death before you, therefore you should choose life, in order that you and your seed shall live." (Devarim 30:19) HaShem provides freedom of choice to the human being.

The Blackened Scroll – (revised, based on an article by Nicholas Wade) – "Nearly half a century ago, archaeologists found a charred ancient scroll, in the ark of a synagogue, on the western shore of the Dead Sea. The lump of carbonized parchment could not be opened or read. Its curators did nothing but conserve it, hoping that one day, new technology might emerge, to make the scroll legible. Just such a technology has now been perfected by computer scientists at the University of Kentucky. Working with biblical scholars in Jerusalem, they have used a computer to unfurl a digital image of the scroll."

"This is the earliest evidence of the exact form of the Masoretic text, said Dr. Emanuel Tov, an expert on the Dead Sea Scrolls. Experts say this new method may make it possible to read other ancient scrolls, including several Dead Sea Scrolls and about 300 carbonized ones from Herculaneum, which were destroyed by the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in A.D. 79."

When I graduated from Yeshiva College in 1968, my late mother graciously sent me on a trip called the YU Tour, which involved stops in Europe and Israel. One of the European stops was the ruins of Pompeii, destroyed by the eruption of Vesuvius. I thought then and I think now that that destruction was punishment inflicted by Heaven on the Romans for the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple.

"The feat of recovering the text was made possible by software programs developed by W. Brent Seales, a computer scientist at the University of Kentucky. He developed a method called virtual unwrapping, to model the surface of an ancient scroll in the form of a mesh of tiny triangles. Each triangle can be resized by the computer until the virtual surface makes the best fit to the internal structure of the scroll..."

"The surviving content of the En-Gedi Scroll, the first two chapters of Leviticus, represents the first severely damaged, ink-based scroll to be unrolled and identified noninvasively. Dr. Tov writes 'we now have evidence that this text was being used from a very early date by Jews in the Land of Israel.'"
