Parashas Vayelech – Endings and Beginnings

With Parashas Vayelech, we are approaching the end of the Torah. The last parashah, of course, is VeZos-HaBerachah. But all I said was “approaching.” In Vayelech, we find Moshe Rabbeinu, taking leave of his People. He informs the People of Israel that Yehoshua bin Nun will be his replacement, and lead them into Eretz Yisrael to confront and defeat their enemy nations. “Be strong and of good courage, do not be afraid of them and do not be broken down before them, for HaShem, your God - it is He Who goes before you. He will not abandon you nor will He forsake you.” Devarim (31:6)

And shortly we will begin the Torah once again, with Parashas Bereshis; “In the beginning of God’s creating the heavens and the earth - when the earth was absolutely empty, with darkness upon the face of the deep, and the Divine Presence hovered over the surface of the waters – God said, ‘Let there be light,’ and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and God separated between the light and the darkness. God called the light, ‘Day,’ and the darkness He called ‘Night.’ And there was evening, and there was morning, one day.” Bereshis (1:1-5)

Back to VaYeLech, and Moshe’s speech to the Children of Israel: “And he said to them, ‘I am one hundred twenty years today, I am forbidden to go out and come in, for HaShem has said to me, ‘You shall not cross this Yarden.’” Rashi explains that it was not for weakness that Moshe could not go, for elsewhere the Torah has said of him, “And Moshe’s strength was not diminished and his eyesight was not dimmed.” Devarim (34:7) Rather, Moshe meant that HaShem had forbidden him to cross the Yarden. Permission to proceed had been denied him and transferred to Yehoshua. But the beginning of a new and glorious life awaited Moshe, “servant of HaShem,” in the “World to Come.”

Knowledge, Torah and Secular: Chinuch, Torah Education, begins early in life for boys and girls. Some say that it begins at the mother’s knee. Others say that it begins with the “Aleph-Bais,” the 22 letters of the Hebrew Alphabet, proceeds to the Chumash, containing the early history of the Jewish People, the Avos and the Imahos, the Aseres HaDibros and the Taryag Mitzvos. The Written Torah and the Oral Torah. Mishnayos and Gemara. Individuals are required to devote their lives to it. Some achieve the Keser Torah, and become Talmidei Chachamim.

When one encounters a great scholar in Torah wisdom, one recites the blessing: “Blessed are You, HaShem, our God, King of the universe, Who has apportioned of His knowledge to those who fear Him.”

Secular Knowledge: One learns the marvels of HaShem’s creation by studying nature, the human body, astronomy, chemistry and physics – we recite the blessing: “Blessed are You, HaShem, our God, King of the universe, Who fashioned man with wisdom and created within him many openings and many cavities. It is obvious and known before Your Throne of Glory that if but one of them were to be ruptured or but one of them were to be blocked, it would be impossible to survive and to stand before You. Blessed are You, Who heals all flesh and acts wondrously.

When one encounters a great scholar in secular wisdom, one recites the blessing: “Blessed are You, HaShem, our God, King of the universe, Who has given of His knowledge to human beings.”
