Parashas Acharei Mos – Kedoshim Yom HaAtzmaut and Birthdays

This year, Yom HaAtzmaut was celebrated on the 6th of Iyar, rather than on the 5th of Iyar. It was postponed because Yom HaZikaron, celebrated on the 4th of Iyar, would have come out on Sunday; the two holidays were moved for fear of "Chilul Shabbat." My wife also informed me that, based on my birth certificate and on a computer program linking Hebrew dates and English dates, my Hebrew birthday was actually also the 6th of lyar, unlike my previous belief that it was the 7th of Iyar. Therefore, Yom HaAtzmaut, the birthday of the State of Israel, and my birthday coincided this year. What a great honor!

Birthdays are not a common occurrence in the Chumash. Yoseph, being held unjustifiably in

the prison of the "Sar HaTabachim," found two fellow prisoners with sad faces. They had dreamt dreams which seemed meaningful, but they were not able to understand them. Yoseph volunteered to interpret their dreams. He said that in three days, the Pharaoh would restore the "Sar HaMashkim" to his position, but he would hang the "Sar HaOfim." We find the following: "And it was on the third day, **Pharaoh's birthday,** that he made a feast for all his servants, and he counted the "Sar HaMashkim" and the "Sar HaOfim" among his servants. He restored the "Sar HaMashkim" to his former position, and he placed the cup on Pharaoh's palm. But he hanged the "Sar HaOfim," just as Yoseph had interpreted for them. But the "Sar HaMashkin" did not remember Yoseph, but forgot him." (Bereshis 40:20-23) Two years later, Pharaoh himself had two mystifying and frightening dreams, and he was unable to extract satisfactory explanations from his dream interpreters. Suddenly the "Sar HaMashkim" remembered Yoseph, and the great benefit he had provided for him. Pharaoh summoned Yoseph from prison, and Yoseph proceeded to interpret his dreams correctly to the last detail. After this fantastic display, "Pharaoh said to Yoseph, 'Since G-d has informed you of all this, there can be no one so discerning and wise as you. You shall be in charge of my palace and by your command shall all my people be sustained, only by my throne shall I outrank you." (Bereshis 41:38-40) In Sefer Shemos, the Chumash informs us, "A new king arose over Egypt, who did not know of Yoseph. He said to his people, 'Behold! The people, the Children of Israel, are more numerous and stronger than we. Come, let us outsmart it, lest it become more numerous and it may be that if a war will come, it, too, may join our enemies, and wage war against us and go up from the land.' " (Shemos 1:8-10) This evil Pharaoh feared a "fifth column," and proposed enslaving the People of Israel and drowning their male babies in the Nile. Three months after the birthday of Moshe, his parents hid him in a wicker basket and set him afloat on the Nile. The

The Exodus from Egypt was the **physical birthday** of the Jewish People.

and the redeemer of Israel; yet he maintained him in the palace.

Receiving the Torah on Mt. Sinai was the spiritual birthday of the Jewish People.

July 4, 1776 was the Day of Independence of the United States of America, a unique nation in that the founders were steeped in the Hebrew Bible as well as in their Bible, and the USA was the first country to recognize Israel in the vote of the United Nations.

daughter of Pharaoh went down to bathe in the Nile, saw the basket, and heard the infant cry-

ing, and took pity on him. Moshe would not nurse from an Egyptian woman, so Miriam made the connection between Yocheved, his mother, and "bas Pharaoh." Yocheved nursed Moshe

until a suitable age to deliver him to the daughter of Pharaoh, who raised him, the future re-

deemer of Israel, in her father's palace. Now, evil though he certainly was, Pharaoh must have had some inkling that the boy he was raising as his grandson would be the Messenger of G-d

On Yom HaAtzmaut, the birthday of the State of Israel, the Jewish People served notice to the rest of the world that HaShem was returning to His Land and returning His People to their Land.

"Sound the great Shofar for our freedom, raise the banner to gather our exiles and gather us together from the four corners of the earth. Blessed are You, HaShem, Who gathers in the dispersed of His People Israel."
