## Parashas-Vayikra Animal Sacrifices in Ancient and Messianic Times

I can think of few topics so controversial in our advanced day and age as animal sacrifices as a form of Divine worship and, more specifically, in the future time of the Jewish Messiah and the next Temple. There are several instances of Biblical support for and in opposition to the notion presented above: For: Referring to animal sacrifices in ancient times: "Now the man, Adam, had known his wife Eve, and she conceived and bore Cain, saying, 'I have acquired a man with HaShem.' And additionally she bore his brother Abel. Abel became a shepherd, and Cain became a tiller of the ground. Cain brought an offering of the fruit of the ground; and Abel also brought of the firstlings of his flock and from his choicest. HaShem turned to Abel and to his offering. But to Cain and to his offering He did not turn..." (Bereshis 4:1-5)

As evidence of gratitude for surviving the ravages of the Flood, we find: "Then Noach built an altar to HaShem and took of every clean animal and every clean bird, and offered burnt-offerings on the altar" (Bereshis 8:20)

As a prayer for support: "Samuel took a suckling lamb and offered it up entirely as an elevationoffering to HaShem; Samuel cried out to HaShem in behalf of Israel and HaShem answered him." (Samuel I, 7:9)

Against: "Samuel said, 'Does HaShem delight in elevation-offerings and feast-offerings, as in obedience to the voice of HaShem?,,, You have rejected the voice of HaShem, so He has rejected you as King.' " (Samuel I, 15:9)

In favor of kindness, rather than sacrifices: "What can I do for you, Ephraim, What can I do for you, Yehudah, when your kindness is like a morning cloud and like the dew that departs in early morning... For I desire kindness, not sacrifice, and knowledge of God more than burnt-offerings?" (Hosea 6:4-6) How shall we approach HaShem? - "He has told you. O Man, what is good! What does HaShem require of you but to do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?" (Michah 6:6, 8) Rambam: The Rambam appears to be of two minds on the matter before us: In Moreh Nevuchim, he assures a confused student that HaShem does not command a human being to suddenly reverse his behavior, but weans him away from his previous behavior gradually.

In his Presentation of the Nusach HaHaggadah, we find, on the other hand, "Blessed be HaShem our God, King of the universe, Who redeemed us and redeemed our ancestors from Mitzrayim and brought us this evening to eat Matzoh and Marror, in just such a way may You bring us to other Holidays and Pilgrim Festivals which are approaching us in Peace, joyous in the rebuilding of Your city and exultant in Your worship, and may we eat there from the Regular Sacrifices and Pesach Sacrifices, the blood of which will reach the wall of Your altar according to Your will and we will there express our gratitude by singing before You a new song on our Salvation and upon the Redemption of our Souls...'

And in Hilchos Bais HaBechirah, we find, "It is a Positive Command to construct a 'House for HaShem' ready for the Sacrificing of Sacrifices...Once the Temple is built in Yerushalayim, all other places become forbidden as sites for 'Houses for HaShem' and to offer there any sacrifice forever." (Hilchos Bais HaBechirah 1:1, 3)

Rav Kook: "Commenting on the first line of the Haftarah of Shabbos HaGadol, 'May the offering of Yehudah and Yerushalayim be pleasant to the L-rd as in the days of old and as in the ancient years' (Malachi 3:4). Rav Kook wrote, "In the future, the abundance of knowledge will spread to and penetrate even animals...and the sacrifices will be pleasing to G-d as in days of old and in yesteryear..." This has led some to claim that Rav Kook believed that there will only be vegetarian sacrifices in the third Bais HaMikdash. However, elsewhere, Rav Kook states his belief that there will be animal sacrifices in the time of the Third Temple. He writes: "And regarding sacrifices, it is more correct to believe that everything will return to its place, and G-d willing, be fulfilled when the redemption comes, and prophecy and the Divine Spirit return to Israel."

Rav Kook thus maintains that in the Messianic Age, there will be animal sacrifices. However, he also quotes Kabbalistic sources that describe some other far distant future, when the whole nature of the world will change, and animals will be on a human level. Then of course no sacrifices will be brought from these "intelligent" animals. It would seem that according to Ray Kook's understanding, it is about this far-distant period that Malachi (3:4) prophesied. Ray Kook's vision of an ideal world with only vegetarian sacrifices will come much later in the Messianic period, and follow "Techiyas HaMesim." Well, then, what can we expect? I guess, we will just have to be patient.
