## Parashas Tzav – “Different Kinds of Sacrifices; In the Future and the Distant Future –With a Haggadic Perspective

Parashas Tzav speaks of five kinds of Sacrifices: the “Olah,” the Elevation Offering, the “Minchah,” the Grain Offering, the “Chatas,” the Sin Offering, the “Asham,” the Guilt Offering, and the “Shelamim,” the Peace Offering. Four of the five involve taking the life of an animal. Only the “Minchah” does not.

“This is the law of the Grain Offering: The sons of Aharon shall bring it before HaShem, to the front of the Altar. They shall separate from it with their three-fingers-full some of the some of the fine flour of the Grain Offering and some of its oil, and all the frankincense that is on the Grain Offering; and he shall cause them to go up in smoke on the Altar for a satisfying aroma – its memorial portion unto HaShem...” (VaYikra 6:7-11)

The question is, “What will be the case ultimately: will the Jewish people still be using animal sacrifices, or will the Temple Service have evolved, such that only the ‘Minchah’ will still be in use?”

On one hand, we find in the “Haggadah,” the following: “Blessed are You, HaShem, our G-d, King of the Universe Who Redeemed us and our Ancestors from Egypt and brought us this night to eat Matzah and Marror. So shall it be HaShem, our G-d, and the G-d of our Ancestors bring us in the future to other Festivals and Pilgrim Festivals which are coming towards us in Peace, happy in the rebuilding of Your City and rejoicing in Your Service, and may we eat there from the Sacrifices and from the Pesach Sacrifices, the blood of which will reach the wall of Your Altar according to Your Will... Blessed are You, HaShem, Who has Redeemed Israel.”

The mention of blood strongly suggests that animal sacrifices will be associated with the Temple Service.

On the other hand, we find in an essay by Rav Avraham Yitzchok HaKohen Kook, called “Fragments of Light,” the following: “The free movement of the moral impulse is to establish Justice for Animals... The first man had not been allowed to eat meat (Sanhed. 59b), as is implied in G-d's instruction to Adam: ‘I have given you every herb yielding seed which is on the face of the earth, and every tree in which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed – it shall be for you for food. (Gen. 1:29)’ But when humanity suffered a setback and was unable to bear the great light of its illumination... it became necessary to confine the concern with Justice to Mankind...”

How did Rav Kook deal with the Theory of Evolution? We find in “The Lights of Holiness” the following:

“The Theory of Evolution that is presently gaining acceptance in the world has a greater affinity with the secret teachings of the Kabbalah than all other philosophies.”

“Evolution, which proceeds on a course of improvement, offers us the basis of optimism in the world. How can we despair when we realize that everything evolves and improves? In probing the inner meaning of evolution toward an improved state, we find here an explanation of the divine concepts with absolute clarity. It is precisely the ‘Ein Sof’ in action that manages to bring to realization the infinite potentiality.”

“Evolution sheds light on all the ways of G-d. All existence evolves and ascends... It ascends towards the heights of the absolute good... This is its general ascent: No particularity will remain outside, not a spark will be lost from the ensemble. All will share in the climactic culmination.”
